Plan to come to *both of the sessions*, not just the one where you are presenting. Seeing other talks, and hearing them critiqued, will help you to present your own work better. I will post a schedule for signups on Piazza.

Please bring one paper copy of your slides (2 per page) to your presentation. In the talk, it is important to show the framework or organization of the paper. You will likely *not* have time to present everything in your paper; the talk must tell a story of its own, which will be a subset of what is in the paper. Make sure that you go into some aspect of your paper in depth, so show that there is substance to your work.
